IATA 7.3 - Dangerous Goods Regulations (DGR) for Processing DG Consignments - Initial

Introduction

This Training course is for personnel responsible for processing dangerous goods consignments as per IATA DGR section 1.5 and in accordance with CBTA approach for well-defined function 7.3. - Previously covered under category 3.

- → Importance of accurate identification and classification of dangerous goods
- → Safety implications of packaging types and net quantity limitations
- → End-to-end communication of hazards and handling requirements using correct marks and labels
- → Radioactive material transportation
- → Impact of State and Operator variations on dangerous goods acceptance

Professional personnel working in the field of transport of Dangerous Goods by air who are responsible for the process and acceptance of Dangerous Goods Consignments in accordance with the IATA Dangerous Goods Regulations.
